- Statements 1-4 deal mostly with our <u>vertical</u> relationship with <u>God</u>.
- Statements 5-7 address our horizontal relationships with others.

The Fourth Blessing Statement

1. The merciful

Matthew 9:11-13 (12:7,

11 Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners? **12** But when he heard it, he said, Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. **13** Go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.' For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners.

Matthew 23:23

Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness.

2. They shall receive mercy

Matthew 7:2

For with the judgment you pronounce you will be judged, and with the measure you use it will be measured to you.

Matthew 6:14

For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.
