	lical examples of fasting: Moses fasted for two 40 day periods (Exodus 34:28, Deut. 9:9, 10:10) Hannah fasted when she as asking God for a child (1 Sam. 1:1-20) The king of Nineveh called for a fast when he learned the Lord was going to judge the city (Jonah 3:7-8) Jehoshaphat called for a fast when armies threatened Judah (2 Chron. 20:3) Ezra led the people to fast before they departed for the return journey to Israel (Ezra 8:21–23) Nehemiah fasted and prayed when he heard the condition of Jerusalem (Neh. 1:4) Esther called the people to fast before she approached the emperor (Esth. 4:16) Daniel fasted partially for 21 days during a time of mourning (Dan. 10:2-3) Anna fasted on a regular basis as part of her ministry at the temple (Luke 3:37) Jesus fasted for 40 days when He was tempted in the wilderness (Matt. 4:2) The disciples of John the Baptist fasted regularly (Matt. 9:14) Paul fasted for three days after his conversion (Acts 9:9) The leaders at Antioch were fasting when Paul and Barnabas were called to missionary work (Acts 13:1-3) Paul and Barnabas fasted as they appointed elders in new churches (Acts 14:23)
