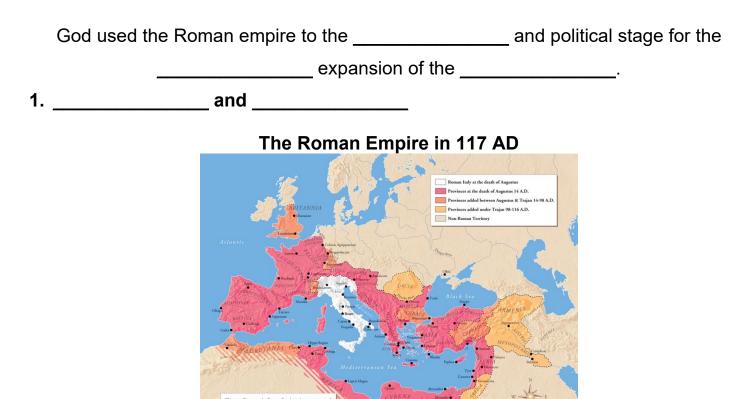

- The reign of Caesar Augustus began the Pax Romana, a 200-year time of peace in the Roman world.
- The Romans did not propagate Roman culture. They adopted Greek culture.
- The Romans were ambitious builders: cities, roads, bridges, aqueducts.



3. significance

- The Roman empire is the political backdrop of the New Testament story.
- Roman Emperors mentioned in Scripture:
 - Octavian/Augustus; Luke 2:1
 - Tiberius: Luke 3:1-2
 - o Claudius; Acts 11:28, 18:1
 - Nero (not by name); Acts 25:1
- Other Roman characters of note:
 - Pilate, Roman Governor of Judea
 - Roman Centurions; Matthew 8:5ff, Mark 15:39ff, Acts 21-27
 - Cornelius; Acts 10:1ff
 - The Philippian Jailer; Acts
